#### The New Rate Relief Scheme for Small Businesses

From 01 April 2023, occupation of businesses with a rateable value of £14,999 or less on the new 2023 rating list may be able to get rate relief which will reduce their business rates. Businesses with a rateable value of between £15000 and £51000 will have their rates calculated using the Small Business Rate multiplier rather than the National Non Domestic Rates multiplier resulting in a small reduction.

To cover the cost of the relief, all businesses which **do not** qualify for it will be charged a 'small business rate supplement', which will be added to their rates bill.

Unfortunately if you are eligible for a mandatory type of relief i.e. Charity or Rural Rate Relief you are unable to claim Small Business Rate Relief

#### Will I qualify for relief?

Yes, if you meet one of the descriptions below:

You occupy only one property in England from which you carry out your business (that is, one 'rateable hereditament') and its rateable value in the 2023 rating list is £14,999 or less;

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> You **occupy** more than one rateable property ('hereditament') but the total rateable value for them all is less than £19,999 **and** each 'additional' property has a rateable value less than £2,899. This might apply if you have one main property plus some car parking spaces, or a separate store or workshop. You can claim relief on the main property but you will have to pay full rates for the additional properties, including the small business rate supplement.

NB: If you are sole trader and also involved in a partnership this is classed as two businesses and therefore you will not qualify for this Relief.

#### How much relief can I get?

It depends on the rateable value of your property:

Rateable value Less than £12,000	Amount of relief 100% of your business rates
£12,001 to £14,999	The Relief is tapered depending on your Rateable Value.
£12,001 to £50,999	You will not get relief but your rates will be calculated using the small business rates multiplier instead.

#### Do I need to apply for the relief?

<u>Under the regulations you are required to advise the business rates office, within 4 weeks, if any of the following changes in your circumstances occur after you have submitted your application.</u>

- If you start to occupy a new business premises, after submitting your application either as another type of business or as part of a partnership.
- If there is a change in rateable value of any properties which you occupy which are outside of the South Derbyshire District Council area.

The form needs to be **signed** by the ratepayer, or a person authorised to sign on their behalf - that is, a partnership, a trustee of a trust, a director of a limited company, or any person properly authorised to sign on the ratepayer's behalf.
