


A message from

This year's policing budget has been shaped by the views of people and communities across Derbyshire and Derby City. I have continued to listen closely to residents about your priorities for community safety and what matters most in your local area.

Despite ongoing funding challenges, we made strong progress last year. Under the government's Neighbourhood Guarantee, we **increased Police Officer numbers**, and since launching our dedicated ASB Hotspot Patrols in July 2023, **anti-social behaviour has fallen by 24%** in hotspot locations. In the year to October 2025, **violence against women and girls fell by 1.2%** compared with the previous year. Increased targeted police activity, including stop and search, led to a **33.6% rise in drug possession detections**, reflecting our proactive approach to tackling drug dealing in our neighbourhoods.

There has also been a **24.3% reduction in deaths or serious injuries caused by unlawful driving**, which was supported by targeted work on killed or serious injury (KSI) collisions. We have responded to growing concerns about e-scooters by **seizing more than 700 since November 2024**, compared with just over 140 in the previous three years.

Our Immediate Justice scheme continues to deliver meaningful results, with over **70% of participants who completed the scheme not reoffending**.

Together with our partners, we remain committed to preventing and tackling serious violence and keeping our communities safe. Ensuring the Chief Constable and the Force have the resources to manage both emerging and existing risks is essential, particularly as policing demand and the complexity of that demand continues to rise.

I am grateful to everyone who took part in the largest budget survey we have ever carried out in Derbyshire. Notably, **73% of respondents** said they were willing to pay £15 more per year, which will be £1.25 a month for a Band D property, to help protect vital services, tackle crime, support victims and build safer and stronger communities.

Some of the areas this year's
budget will support are:

Serious Violence including VAWG

- **Operation Sceptre:** Targeting knife crime enforcement and raising awareness of knife crime.
- **Introduction of Sexual Offences Liaison Officers:** Providing early and continued support for victims of rape and serious sexual abuse.
- **Serious violence and VAWG awareness training:** Bystander training within post-16 educational centres.
- **Domestic Abuse Teams:** Improving outcomes and providing a consistent service to victims.

ASB and Community Safety

- **Hotspot Patrols:** Targeting anti-social behaviour.
- **Immediate Justice Scheme:** Ensuring offenders pay back into communities.
- **Geo-fencing Patrol Technology:** Targeting police patrols and keeping the public informed.
- **Utilising advanced technology to target dangerous motorists:** Detecting high-risk behaviour to reduce collisions and protect vulnerable road users.

Neighbourhood Policing

- **Recruitment of more police officers:** To be assigned to neighbourhoods throughout Derbyshire.
- **Dedicated Rural Crime Team:** To tackle rural criminality.
- **Home Burglary Response:** Police attendance for every reported home burglary.
- **Improved Technology:** Further reducing 101 call waiting times and improving customer experience.



Bringing Offenders to Justice

- **Clear, Hold, Build Project:** Tackling organised crime through targeted activity and partnership working.
- **Investigations Programme:** Improving the quality of investigations and services for victims of crime.
- **Quarterly enforcement operations:** Targeting high-risk suspects who cause greater harm on communities.
- **Increased use of protective orders:** To target repeat offenders and protect vulnerable victims from harm.

Drug Dealing and Substance Misuse

- **Tackling County Lines:** Focus on dismantling drug networks, targeting criminal proceeds and accelerating asset recovery.
- **Drug Testing on Arrest:** Extending programme to a wider range of offences to divert more offenders into treatment.
- **Naloxone:** Officers across the county continue to carry the life saving drug, to reduce the effects of a drug overdose.
- **Outreach Services:** Support for young people with substance misuse issues.

Supporting Victims and Safeguarding

- **Vulnerability Hub:** Ensuring incidents reported get the right response at the earliest opportunity.
- **Victim Care Team:** Ensuring all victims' needs are met.
- **Improved High Harm Function:** Tackling repeat offenders through harm prevention orders.
- **Enhanced and Rapid Video Response:** Putting victims in front of an officer as soon as possible.
